

MAGENTA PIGLET

Hook - Gold
Thread - Fire Orange
Tag - Gold Oval
Tail - Magenta Boar Bristles
 Rainbow Krystal Flash
Hackle - Magenta Badger cock
Rib - Oval Gold
Body - Magenta Pigs fur
Hackle - Magenta Badger cock
Eyes - Jungle Cock



Secure the hook in the vice. Tie in the thread and wind down to the point tying in a length of Gold Oval as you go down. Wind the Oval 4 turns backwards to form a tag, take the Oval between the 2 hooks and pull back towards the head. Secure with the thread and trim off. Tie in four Magenta Boar bristles 2-3 times as long as the hook. Arrange them in a nice fan shape. Coat the body with superglue and bind down tightly to the head. Trim off the waste. Take the thread back to the tail. Tie in 2 strands of Rainbow Krystal flash half the length of the bristles. Tie in a Magenta Badger cock hackle by the tip, double it and wind 4-6 turns. This should be slightly shorter than the flash. Tie in and trim off the waste. Tie in a length of Oval Gold tightly and trim the waste. Cut some of the Magenta underfur off the Bristle skin, if you have not bought your bristles on the skin use Magenta Seals Fur. Wax the thread well and dub the fur onto it. Take the thread to the head forming the body. Rib the body with the Oval, tie in and trim the waste. Tie in a Magenta Badger cock hackle by the tip. Double it and wind 4 turns. This hackle should be slightly shorter than the rear one. Take some turns of thread tight up to the base to slope it backwards. Prepare a pair of Jungle Cock eyes and tie in slightly on top of the hook. Double the waste ends back and tie in tightly. Form a nice head and whip finish. Now apply a coat of superglue and when dry several coats of thin clear varnish to produce a smooth shiny head.
